NEW YORK — The Golden State Warriors' Stephen Curry has won the 2014-15 NBA Most Valuable Player Award. The Golden State Warriors' guard set a single-season record for three-pointers made, and led his team to the league's best regular-season ever with 67 wins. He led his team in scoring, assists, and steals.

Curry got the most first-place votes from a panel of sportswriters and broadcasters who cover the NBA. Other players receiving ballot votes in the top five included the Houston Rockets' James Harden (second), the Cleveland Cavaliers' LeBron James (third), the Oklahoma City Thunder's Russell Westbrook (fourth), and the New Orleans Pelicans' Anthony Davis (fifth).

Stephen Curry helped the Warriors with per-game averages of 23.8 points, 7.7 assists, 2.04 steals, and 4.3 rebounds. Curry set an NBA record by making 286 three-pointers. Curry also led the NBA in free throw percentage (91.4%), making a career-high 52 consecutive free throws over games that spanned almost a full month.
